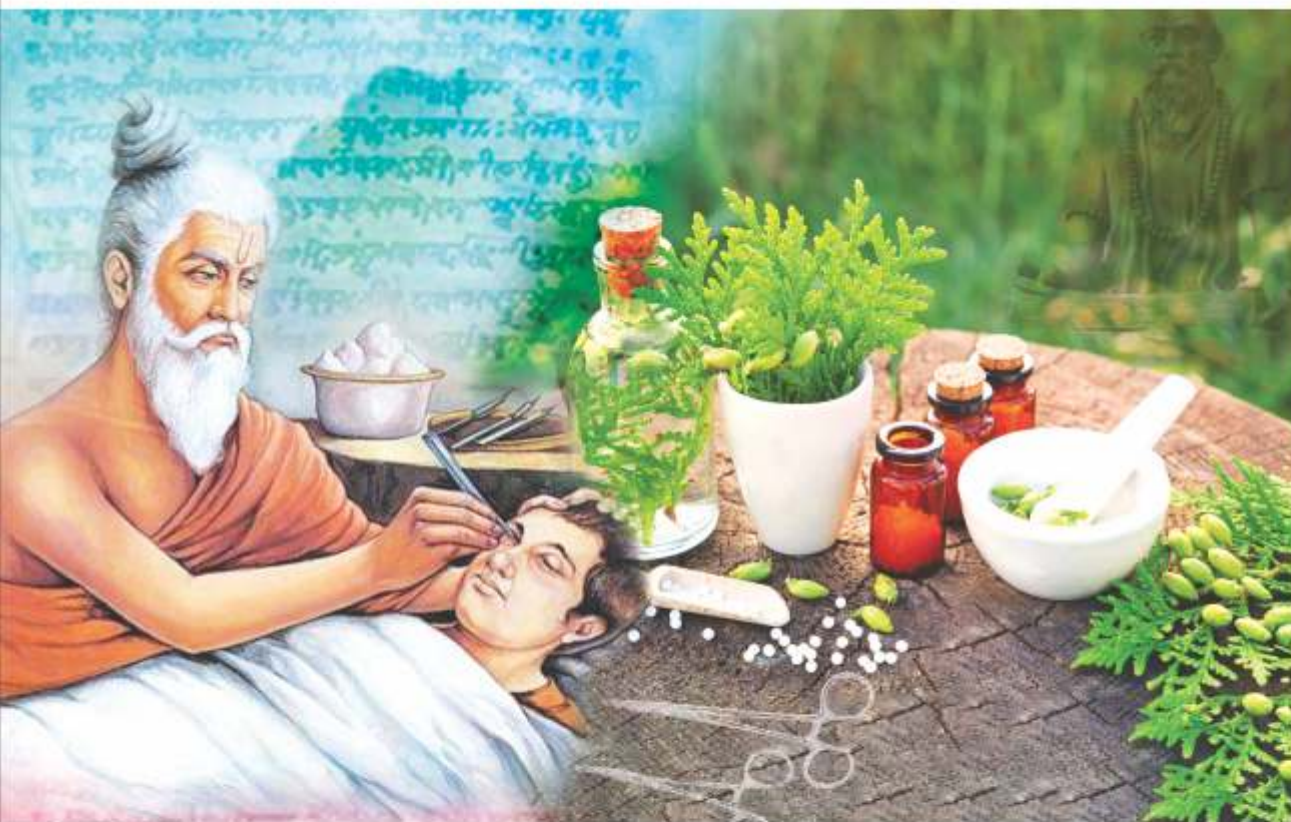

# MEDICINE : COMPASSION CAN HEAL THE SUFFERING WHEEL

## AYURVEDA : THE SCIENCE OF LONGEVITY

Popularly known as the 'Science of Life', Ayurveda, one of the earliest medical sciences originated in ancient India, dates back to Iron Age India (1st millennium BC) and is still practiced today as a form of complementary and alternative medicine. Charaka, the father of medicine, consolidated Ayurveda 2500 years ago and since then it has evolved globally. Even the most advanced countries are now inclined to adopt the Ayurvedic System of medicine under various names like traditional medicine or herbal medicine. India has already signed agreements with countries like Bulgaria, Latvia, Russia, Chile, Spain, South Africa, Bangladesh and Malaysia to promote Ayurveda.

## SHASTRAKARMA : THE ART OF SURGERY

Cataract surgery was first found in ancient India and was performed with a curved needle used to loosen the lens and push the cataract out of the field of vision. These methods were later spread to the world. Sushruta, the father of surgery with health scientists of his time conducted complicated surgeries like cesareans, cataract, artificial limbs, fractures, urinary stones and even plastic surgery and brain surgery 2600 years ago.

India had 732000 Gurukuls at the time when the first school in England opened in 1811 .

### CHESS

A board game originated from Chaturanga an old Indian two-player board game that was invented at least 1,500 years ago in ancient India. The Arabians adapted it to a game they called shatranj, which was later embraced by the Europeans during the Medieval Period and, after a few modifications, is now known as chess.

### SNAKES & LADDERS (MOKSHA PATAM)

The childhood favourite Snakes and Ladders, has its origin in India and was called Gyan Chaupar or Mokshapat, used to teach Hindu values to children. The good deeds act like ladders to achieve heaven, whereas snakes symbolise sins and vices pushing one back into a cycle of re-births. The British took the game to England in 1892 and named it Snakes and Ladders.

### LUDO

Before it was called Ludo, it was a 4th-century Indian game called Chaupar/Chausar made out of cloth or jute finds its earliest evidence in the Mahabharat. In fact, this Indian board game was in high demand in other imperial courts of the world too.

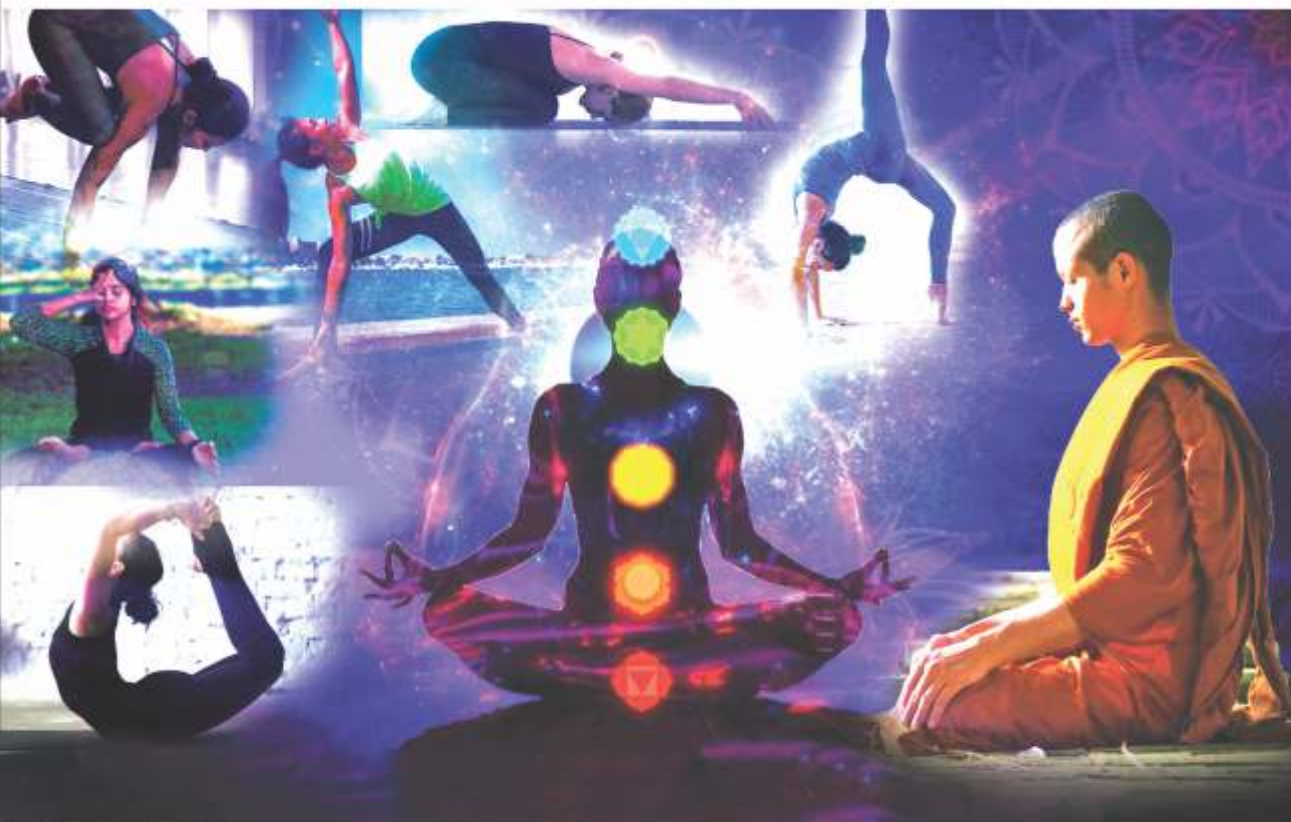

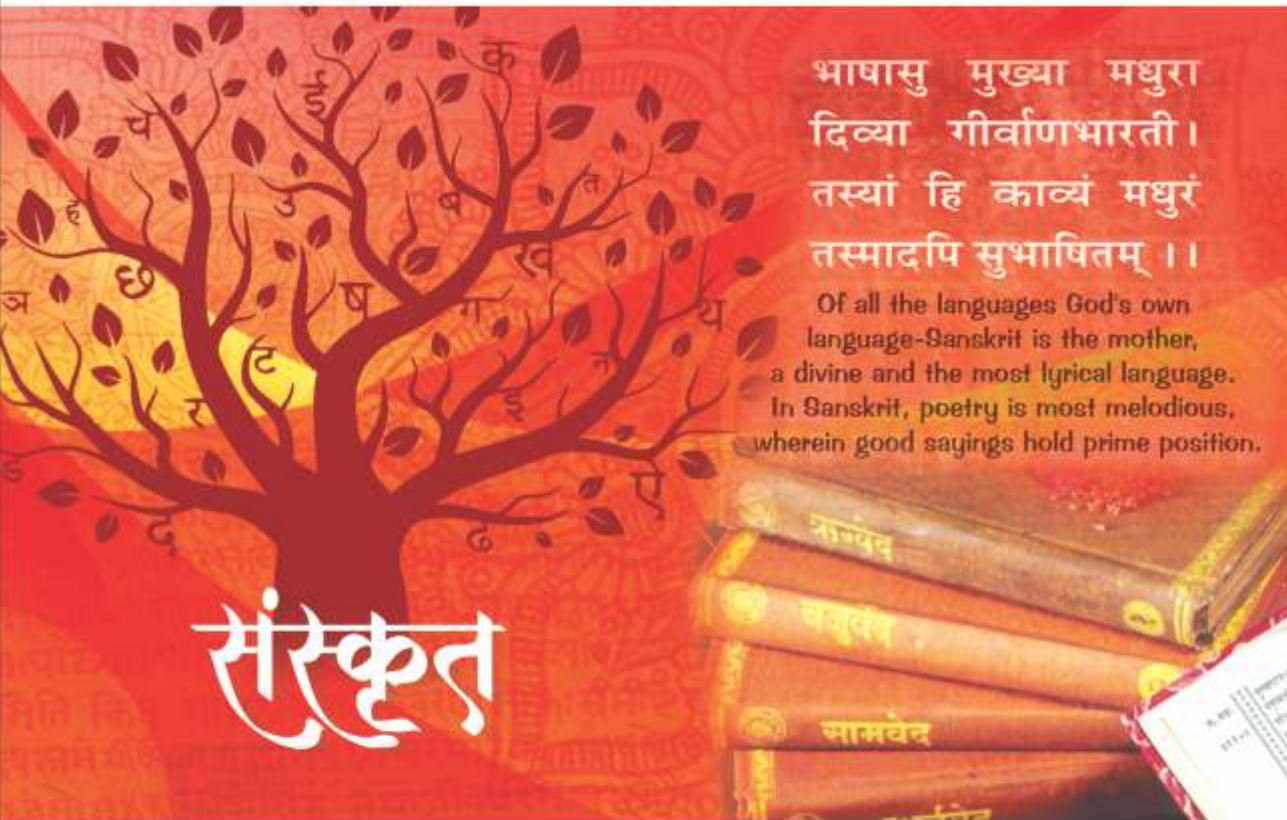

India's signature fabric, **Khadi** is a symbol of textile heritage. By medieval era, hand-woven Indian muslin was in great demand across the world for its fine translucent quality.

India taught the world to cultivate **Jute** and also exported raw jute to the western world, where it was used to make ropes and cordage.

The process of producing **crystallized sugar** from sugarcane was discovered by the time of the Imperial Guptas, and the earliest reference of candied sugar comes from India. Chinese documents confirm two missions to India, for obtaining technology for sugar-refining.

According to the Gemological Institute of America, up until 1896, India was the only source for **diamonds** to the world.

In ancient times, **commodities** like palm oil, coconut oil, cotton cloth, clarified butter, dyes, perfumes like sandalwood oil, musk tamarind, camphor, cast iron, tin sheets, copper vessels, and even crude glass crockery were being exported from India.

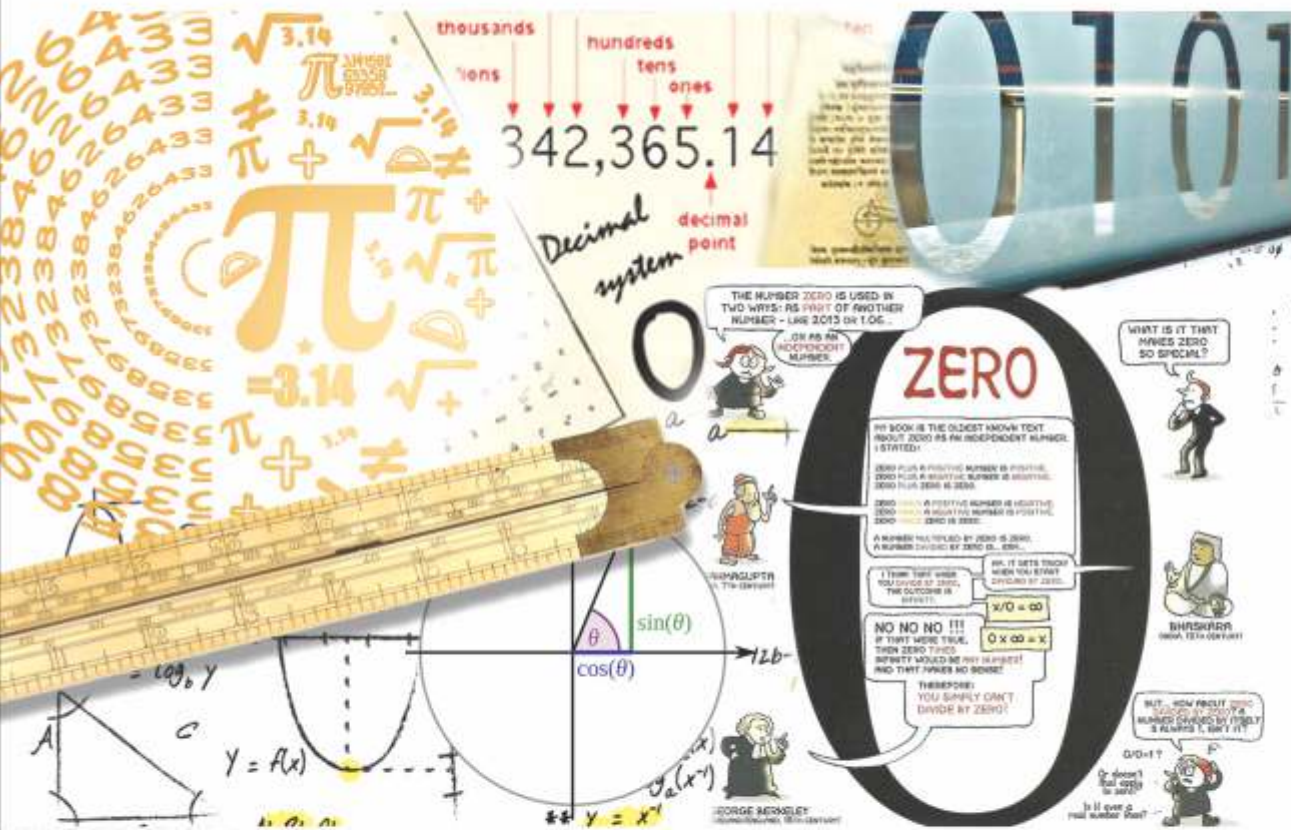

## MATHEMATICS : INTRIGUING BLEND OF LOGIC AND COMPLEXITY

Synonymous with the poetry of logical ideas and music of reason, mathematics is a voyage from Complication to implication and from Irrationality to logicity. Ancient Indian mathematicians have contributed immensely to the field of mathematics which emerged in the Indian subcontinent from 1200 BCE until the end of the 18th century. As well as giving the concept of zero, Indian mathematicians made seminal contributions to the study of trigonometry, algebra, arithmetic and negative numbers among other areas. The number system and the decimal system used worldwide today was invented by Indians.

Aryabhata, one of the greatest mathematicians worked on the 'place value system' and Srinivasa Ramanujan contributed in continued fractions, partial sums and products of hyper geometric series etc. The value of pi was first calculated by Budhayana, who explained the concept of what is now known as the Pythagorean Theorem. The Indians taught how to count, without which no worthwhile scientific discovery could have been made.

Unearthing the secrets of the Earth, space, time, Indian scholars recorded Astronomical facts centuries before they were 'discovered' by Westerns. The oldest mention of astronomy in India dates back to second millennium BC and has been found in the Vedas. Some of the earliest roots of Indian astronomy can be dated to the period of Indus Valley Civilization or earlier.

Indian astronomy flowered in the 5th–6th century, with Aryabhata and other astronomers who have been credited with postulating certain fundamental principles of Astronomy including the Helio-centric concept of rotation of Earth around the Sun, prediction of lunar and solar eclipse, concept of gravitational force and mathematics of planetary motion contributing to our understanding of the Modern Astronomy and the methods of Celestial Mechanics used in Space Programmes.
