TIPS FOR PARENTS

1. Start Small Teach only 3–5 sight words at a time and revise daily for strong memory.

2. Create a Print-Rich Environment

Display words around the house—walls, doors, study table, bedside, and play area at the child’s eye level.

3. Smart Placement Matters

Place words in frequently used areas so children see and read them again and again.

4. Link with Daily Life

Encourage your child to read words during routine activities and while reading storybooks.

5. Make it Fun

Use games like flashcards, word hunt, and clap-and-read instead of worksheets.

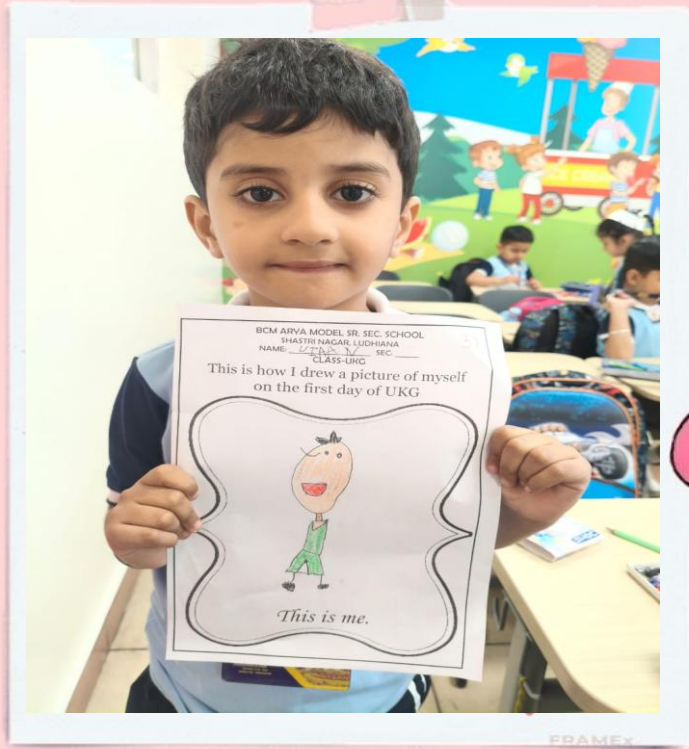
